NHS Orkney 'A Day in the Life'

Working with NHS Orkney, we recently hosted an insight event at the hospital to give young people interested in a health profession career the opportunuity to find out more about these roles.

Fifty-one pupils from S4-S6 at the KGS, Stromness Academy and Sanday Junior High School attended.

Clinicians from 13 different areas of the health profession were on hand to speak to pupils about their roles, answer questions and offer some practical examples of different aspects of their role.

Work Placement Update

In our last newsletter, we highlighted that developing a consistent approach to work experience placements is a priority for DYW Orkney.

We have undertaken three key areas of work, these are: looking into a qualification for pupils undertaking work placements; developing a suite of documents to support work placements and reviewing a pre-existing database which is currently used by Orkney College and the schools to identify work placements.

Documentation

We have completed the suite of documents and they have been shared with the local schools for their use. Included in this are guides for parents, young people and employers which set out the requirements and expectations of all parties when undertaking a work placement.

These guides are in the process of being printed and a copy of the employer guide will be sent to anyone who is currently on the work placement database.

Qualification

It was an ambition of the schools and DYW Orkney to offer a qualification to young people in recogniton of the skills they develop while on a work placement.

We have developed a Workplace Logbook which supports an SQA qualification in Work Placement. Both Stormness Academy and the KGS are piloting the qualification with a group of pupils this year. If you currently support a work placement from either school, you may be asked by the pupil to complete some aspects of their work placment log book. This will include completing an attendance record and providing a report of the young person's duties and conduct while on placement.



The Workplace Logbook has been developed to support a Work Placement qualification.

Employers Database

An intial review of the Work
Experience Employers Database
which is managed by Orkney College
UHI on behalf of the OIC, has been
undertaken and, where possible
details have been updated.

We have now contacted all of the employers on the database asking them to complete a survey confirming if they wish to stay on the database and identifying the type of work experience their business can support.

If you have been sent a link to the survey and haven't yet completed it, please do so as soon as possible. If you haven't received information about the survey but think you should have, please get in touch.

Events in schools

We have worked with partners to offer two events to local young people earlier this month.

Apprenticeships Marketplace

Along with Skills Development
Scotland we held an Apprenticeships
Marketplace for pupils in S3-S6 at the
KGS. Local employers were able to
speak to pupils about the
apprenticeship opportunities that exist
in their organisations as well as give
them advice about what an
apprenticeship entails and guidance
on suitable subjects to study at school.

Orkney College were also on hand to speak about the Foundation and Modern Appernticeships they offer.



Over 250 pupils from the KGS visited the Apprenticeship Marketplace event.

It was particularly useful for us to engage with pupils in S3 ahead of them making their senior phase choices in the new year to get them thinking about different career pathways.

'The Adventures of Jam Boy'

Business Gateway helped us offer young people from Orkney College, Stromness Academy and the KGS an opportunity to hear an inspirational talk from young entrepreneur Fraser Doherty.

Fraser started his first business, SuperJam, in his grandmonther's kitchen when he was just 14 years old. It has since grown into a multi-national business, he has published a SuperJam cook book, co-founded craft beer club Beer52 and he has been awarded an MBE for services to business...and he's still only 29 years old!

Over 400 young people heard Fraser speak about his career journey and his advice on setting up a business and marketing it successfully.
