ABOUT SHEILA FLEET JEWELLERY

Sheila Fleet Jewellery is a Scottish designer, family-run jewellery company established in 1993. Sheila Fleet OBE is one of Scotland's leading designer-makers of silver, silver with enamel, gold and platinum jewellery. All of Sheila's jewellery is designed, made and finished at her Orkney workshop and is sold from their own shops, through stockists and around the world via their website.

Sheila Fleet Jewellery has five retail spaces across Scotland. Two in Orkney - the Kirkwall Gallery & The Kirk Gallery & Café in Tankerness - one each in St Andrews, Glasgow and Edinburgh. They employ 25 staff between Edinburgh, Glasgow and St Andrews and 70 members of staff locally. In Orkney, staff are split between the shops, the Kirk Cafe and the workshop and office, which are located next to the Kirk Gallery and Cafe.
