

BUSINESS STUDIES

The Business Studies department at Orkney College UHI has continued to be innovative in delivery, course development and student support over the past year. Exciting new developments include:

- The addition of the BA (Hons) Events Management course which will allow students to progress into a variety of industry sectors.
- Updating our popular NC Administration course to include remote working and collaboration – a way of working that has accelerated this last year and is likely to continue in some form.
- The introduction of National Progression Award (NPA) courses in Travel & Tourism and Customer Service to allow for retraining and resilience to be sustained in our local economy. These are shorter courses delivered in intense blocks.
- Extending our current SVQ offering to include a Level 8 SVQ in Business & Administration which is on an equivalent level to a HND. If anyone has previously completed their HNC in Business and would like to carry on working while working towards a more advanced qualification, this course will be ideal.
- Carrying out market research with the aim of increasing our digital marketing SVQ and Apprenticeship opportunities to support local need.

CASE STUDY – COLLABORATION



In the past academic year, the department has taken on its first two pieces of research and development, one local to Orkney and the other seeking ways to improve access to mental health across the north of Scotland. Our local project is in partnership with Orcades Marine and aims to develop a suite of a mobile tools for assessing workboat vessel stability prior to sailing and ship manoeuvres, helping improve

the accuracy of their assessment ensuring safety for both vessel and crew. Utilising cutting edge technology and contemporary UX designs, the aim of the tool is to be a non-intrusive addition for skippers and will further enhance and reduce the time taken to perform this essential safety practice.

This exciting knowledge exchange partnership brings together Orkney College UHI based expertise with industry subject specialists in maritime, to enhance the industry and significantly contribute to the learning and teaching offered at Orkney College UHI.

Did you know that two of our previous students enjoyed their courses so much that they stuck around? AJ and David, who both took very different academic and professional journeys, eventually came full circle back home to Orkney College to work as lecturers.
